Equipment

• Clear jug, jar or large bowl, water, Vitamin C or other safe fizzy tablets (or a spoon of sugar).


Set up

Fill up your jug or large bowl with water

Instructions

- Sometimes we feel hurt by the things other people say or do to us. Holding onto those hurts can make us feel sad, or angry. Forgiveness is about letting go.
- Take a piece of tablet (or spoon of sugar) and think about your hurt feelings. When you feel ready, drop it into the water. Watch as it dissolves and imagine the hurt disappearing.
- You may want to pray as you do this, asking God to help you.
