REFLECTION IDEAS



Good Friends – Ruth and Naomi Ruth chapter 1

This GenR8 Connect looks at the importance of friendship and loyalty even when things are difficult. The story is found in the Bible in the book of Ruth (focussing on chapter 1): Naomi has lost both her sons and Ruth, her daughter-in-law, is mourning the loss of her husband. Ruth is a faithful friend to Naomi showing her love, loyalty and support despite the differences between them.

Keywords: Friendship, loyalty, trust, compassion, empathy, listening, forgiveness.

Reflection

Friendship is not always easy, particularly when people are going through hard times - they may not be easy to love. We all need people we can rely on, people who will forgive us when we get things wrong.

- What does it mean to be a good friend?
- Why do you think friends are important?
- Is it ever hard to be a good friend?
- Who do Christians believe is always their friend and will always forgive them?

Equipment

• Two lengths of string or wool, of different colours.

Description

 Friends are very important to us as they can support us in difficult times as well as being with us in good times. This activity helps children to think about what makes a good friend and how they can be good friends to others. You may like to make some suggestions of what these events or characteristics might be.

Instructions

 Think about what makes a good friend – what are the important things. Think of times when someone



has been a good friend to you, or you have had the chance to be a good friend to someone else.

 Take two pieces of string or wool, side by side, and tie a knot in them each time you think of one of these times, or a particular thing that makes a good friend. Keep this to remember what holds good friends together.






Ruth Chapter 1



Naomi and Ruth travel to Naomi's home in Israel.


Naomi and Ruth have lots to eat
